

2011 Ethiopia Demographic and Health Survey (EDHS)


The 2011 Ethiopia Demographic and Health Survey (EDHS) provides up-to-date information on the population and health situation in Ethiopia. The 2011 EDHS is the third national Demographic and Health survey conducted in the country. Repeated surveys allow for an analysis of trends over time.

The survey is based on a nationally representative sample. It provides estimates at the national (urban and rural) and regional levels.


Trends in Household Electricity

Percent of households with electricity




Trends in Literacy

Percent of women age 15-49 and men age 15-59 who can read




Trends in Fertility

Trends in Modern Method Use


Percent of currently married women age 15-49 using a modern method of contraception



Trends in Childhood Mortality


Deaths per 1,000 live births

Trends in Vaccination Coverage


Percent of children age 12-23 months who have received all basic vaccinations (BCG, measles, and 3 doses each of DPT and polio)



Percent of men and women age 15-49 who have ever been tested for HIV and received their results in the 12 months before the survey



HIV Prevalence


■ Women 15-49 ■ Men 15-49 ■ Total 15-49
