

2007 Bangladesh Demographic and Health Survey (BDHS)

The 2007 Bangladesh Demographic and Health Survey (BDHS) provides up-to-date information on the population and health situation in Bangladesh. The 2007 BDHS is the fifth national demographic and health survey conducted in the country.

The survey is based on a nationally representative sample. It provides estimates for rural and urban areas of the country, and for each of the six divisions.






Trends in Female Household Population with No Education




Trends in Fertility




Trends in Childhood Mortality




Current Use of Family Planning




Trends in Immunization Coverage



Trends in Use of Contraception




Trends in Children's Nutritional Status

Trends in Maternal Health Care



Women Men


Percentage who know that the following methods reduce the risk of getting the AIDS virus
